I received this information from the Director of Sales, Denise Roberts. There are 6 Handicap Parking spots on the property and they meet ADA standards. The hotel has space for 5 motor homes, but do not provide hook-up services, just for parking the vehicle.

They also offer complimentary shuttle service within a 5 mile radius. Arrangements can be made in advance for shuttle service. We received a note from the wife of Richard Tremaine informing us of Richard's death on November 10, 2000. On December 11th, we received from Mrs. Tremaine the obit notice and a note telling us that, "Richard was proud to have been part of WWII and had wonderful stories about the USS Balch DD 363."

Received a call from Manuel Cordova to let us know that he had heard about the fellows that were given the grand tour of the USS Hornet, that is now a museum in the former Alameda Naval Air Base. Wanted everyone to know that he would be happy to make arrangements for anyone of the reunion members who would like to tour the ship.

We received several email messages about a brass plaque from the boiler in the engine room of the Porterfield that was for sale on Ebay.com, and so we accessed it and watched the bidding. I will have to see if he will let Jeff Shaffer scan it for the web page.
